Reasons to be cheerful

Bishop David gave the address at the June meeting of the Diocesan Synod. He began by outlining five reasons to be cheerful - not just cheerful, thankful and hopeful too.

• We have a new bishop. Bishop Stephen is someone we already know and who knows us (and still wants to come to Lincolnshire!). He is keen to continue the TTCT journey with us. His installation will be in November, but he's already busy getting out and meeting people across the diocese.

• We have launched our new Local Mission Partnerships. Our new LMPs hosted the Visitation Services this year, instead of our deaneries. So our church wardens for the North-East LMP were sworn-in at Ruskington, for the North-West at Bassingham, and for the South at Sleaford.

• Diocesan finances are beginning to head in the right direction. Income across the diocese has started to increase. And where we now know how many stipends an LMP can

afford, groups of benefices or parishes can start making appointments to fill their vacancies.

• We have appointed eight new Mission Enablers.

Each Deanery Partnership will have its own Mission Enabler. Their brief is to help churches explore ways they can grow the kingdom of God in their locality and to develop their own mission priorities.

• New deacons and priests have been ordained this year. It's always exciting and encouraging to see men and women stepping out into new ministries. There are plenty of opportunities for lay and ordained people – especially now that the new College of St Hugh is up and running. More info on the Diocese of Lincoln website - lots of possibilities!

Doing it differently

We've divided our Deanery Partnership into three Local Mission Partnerships. Which means they're not based on our existing deaneries, as they are in most of the other Deanery Partnerships. We're different in other ways too. We have only one big market town, and only one Type 1 Church. And we don't attract any Low Income Funding, nor any SDF (Strategic Development Fund) money. So we will be relying entirely on parish giving to pay for our stipendiary clergy.

Getting to know you

Meanwhile, our three Local Mission Partnerships are beginning to shape up. The North-West team has been first off the blocks. Clergy and ministry teams have been meeting, and people from different benefices have been getting to know one another over tea and home-made scones. There's more to do, both to get to know the wider and to get to know the wider areas we now belong to.
