Sulutane

The construction of the new toilets and preschool room/ centre for the community is well underway at Sulutane. Johannes visited in mid-December and reports as follows:

"Today I went to Sulutane to evaluate progress made on construction of the preschool. I was pleased with work done last week. Our builders have finished the block works and will now start doing the roof. Timber for the roof has been purchased at Mpaka, it will be delivered on site tomorrow. We intend to purchase the metal sheets for the roof in Mbabane as the Mpaka warehouses do not have strong metal sheets. The best they had was 0.4 mm thick and we know that huge hail stones break 0.4mm thick metal sheets. The ones we can get in Mbabane are 0.5mm thick and will not break.

When they finish the roofing, they will have a break for Christmas and New Year. They will return after New Year to complete the construction."

Johannes and Nomcebo had also been at the preschool the week before because it was the graduation ceremony for children leaving the preschool. This is a huge occasion in a community and was attended by children, parents and some community public figures. Johannes writes:

"Nomcebo and I were very pleased to attend the ceremony. In Eswatini, especially in rural areas, there are very few preschools with qualified teachers. As a result, there are parents who are reluctant to pay school fees for their children because they do not fully appreciate what the children are learning. They assume that children spend time playing as they do in most neighbourhood care points (NCPs). These care points were set up to feed and look after orphans and vulnerable children some years ago during the worst part of the HIV/Aids disaster. Therefore,

Nomcebo and I attend the ceremonies to explain the importance of preschool education to parents and the children showcase what they learn.

Various community leaders including the Chief's representative give speeches and witness what the children are learning in order to publicise the good work that preschools do.

In our case Nomcebo was the main speaker and presented the certificates to graduating children.

The function was held in the new building even though it was not complete; it served the purpose. All the speakers expressed their gratefulness to donors for funding the construction of the building."
